

Objective and activities as of July 2020:

The project was a parallel extension of the BMU funded Lac Tumba Lediima Reserve & Ngiri Triangle project and aimed at conserving the forests in the Ngiri Triangle and their biological diversity. It promoted the function of these forests as carbon reservoirs and with regard to their water regime regulation. The project assisted the establishment of the Ngiri Triangle protected area and improved protected area management. The local population was involved directly in the project and its interests were taken into account. The project partners developed and strengthened participatory bodies and optimised land and resource use in order to avoid any additional appropriation of land. These measures also raised the standard of living across the project region.
