FY 2013 Wildlife Without Borders-Africa Program Summary of Projects in Africa

In 2013, the USFWS awarded 31 new projects and 2 amendments to existing projects from the Wildlife Without Borders – Africa Program totaling \$8,247,751 which was matched by \$10,808,046 in additional leveraged funds. Field projects in seven countries (in alphabetical order below) were supported. Funds also supported several regional projects.

In partnership with the Last Great Ape Organization (LAGA), the purpose of this project is to protect the great apes of Cameroon from illegal hunting by increasing the level of wildlife law enforcement nationwide. It assists the Cameroonian government to increase capacity by identifying large-scale dealers in great ape meat and live great apes; arresting and prosecuting large-scale illegal wildlife exploiters; raising public awareness of wildlife laws and penalties; and serving as a model for action on wildlife law enforcement, NGO-government collaboration, and wildlife crime monitoring.

The project will develop a training program; train eight Lion Guards; enhance conservation of lions and large carnivores in the parks in North Cameroon; mitigate lion-livestock conflict on all project sites; and reduce poaching of lions and their prey on all project sites.

The project builds upon current work supporting the Ministry of Forestry and Wildlife's (MINFOF) anti-poaching patrols and law enforcement management systems (i.e. MIST/SMART) by improving capacity of judicial authorities to implement wildlife law and regulations, building capacity of park staff to

conduct law enforcement and ranger based monitoring, and engaging park staff and community members in collaborative park protection efforts.
